

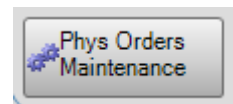
CPOE for Laboratory Orders

More than 30% of laboratory orders created by EP during the EHR reporting period are recorded using CPOE. The CPOE must be directly entered by any licensed healthcare professional that can enter orders into the medical record per state, local and professional guidelines.

How to meet this measure using ONCOCHART - You can create a laboratory order in ONCOCHART by opening a patient's chart and choosing *Physician Orders > Create New Order*. Choose an order that is set as a *Lab Order* and fill in the required information. Please make sure that the *Note* and/or *Signed* date falls within the EHR reporting period.

In order for the MU calculator to register your CPOE as a lab order, you'll need to set the order as a Physician Order and a Lab Order, and you can do so in the *Physician Order Maintenance* Form.

How to set a CPOE as a lab order



- 1.) From within the physician orders module, click on Phys Order Maintenance.
- 2.) Drill down to a final node and select it. *As in the picture, Specific bacterial culture as requested is the selected order.*
- 3.) Click the Edit button
- 4.) Check the *Is Lab Order* box. *Is Physician Order* should also be checked.
- 5.) Click OK
- 6.) You'll need to do this for any order you consider a lab order.
